The government has changed the testing rules for graduating students from once a year to three times a year which allows us to take students regularly rather than only in January. Because of that, we have had a continuous influx of new students and will continue to have until the classes get to advanced for the new students to be able to catch up with their classmates. Bible training is going quite well for the students. New students are making a decision for the Lord on a regular basis. Most of our students are now believers and are experiencing new peace in their lives.
